Welcome back to a new school year! After the summer break, teachers, children and parents are ready for the new school year!

Beginning a new school year is a significant change for all, and it can be difficult, whether your child is returning or new to the school. It's a time when we meet new people, adjust to new routines and classrooms. As we all get to know each other, relationships are formed between the school, families, teachers, and students. Establishing better understanding and communication will create a nurturing environment for our children to develop and flourish.

Our school's first few weeks of a new school year are crucial for students and their families. Our teachers have organised some helpful activities to make the transition easier for children and parents. These activities will allow children to get to know each other and the school better and help everyone adjust to the new routines and classrooms. These activities will make this time of change and adaptation smoother for everyone involved.

Our teachers had sent out welcome emails and introductory videos to all students at the beginning of the year, and we held a Meet The Teachers' Day event where families could visit classrooms and meet their teachers. The event was quite eventful, with teachers busy talking to the children and their families. It was the perfect opportunity for parents and caregivers to get to know their children's teachers and see how their children's classrooms. The feedback we received from families was overwhelmingly positive, which made us all feel proud of our teachers and their efforts to connect with the students and their families.

For our Pre-Nursery level, we planned a transition period for the children, during which we gradually extended school hours. This is because, for most Pre-Nursery children, it is their first experience of attending school without the presence of their parents or caregiver. We aim to help them feel more comfortable and confident in their new environment by easing them into longer school days.

Regarding our older children, their teachers have organised various in-class activities to help them get to know their classmates and people in the school community better. Some class activities include going on a school tour with their teachers and classmates and playing ice-breaker games.

We are off to a great start. Let's make it a successful year through collaboration and participation as much as possible.



IMPORTANT REMINDERS

School Hours

The main door opens at 8:40am for the morning session and 12:55pm in the afternoon. Please do not send your children to school too early. Dismissal time will be 11:45am for the morning session, 3:30pm for the full-day session and 4:00pm for the afternoon session. Please try to encourage your child to be on time when coming to school. Punctuality is an important lesson for children to learn, and also conveys to your child that school is important.

Typhoon and Rainstorm Arrangement

The weather in Hong Kong can be quite unpredictable! In case of bad weather conditions such as typhoons and rainstorm warnings in force, please refer to our weather policy in the Parent's Handbook and check for announcements from the Education Bureau or the Hong Kong Observatory.

Student Card

To ensure the security and safety of your child, parents or guardians must present the student card before picking up their child from school. In the absence of this, the parent or guardian will be required to show his or her ID card and sign a collection form at the office.

Clothing

We recommend that children wear their PIPS uniform except on special occasions. Our uniform allows your child to feel a part of the school while also expressing their personality and preferences through choice of colour. Accidents can happen so please keep a spare set of clothes in your child's school bag. Shoes should be comfortable and safe, with an elastic or velcro strap to help your child to develop their independence. Please mark all clothing, bags, hats and shoes with your child's name to avoid any mix-ups.



IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Safety & Hygiene

Kindly record your child's temperature on the temperature booklet. Children are also required to take temperature upon arrival at school in the Reception area. Please do not send your child to school if they are ill. If your child develops any symptoms at school, parents will be notified and the child may need to be collected early. Please keep 2 face masks in your child's school bag to protect the children from minor symptoms.

Personal Information

Please let our teachers know about any changes in your routine at home as these can dramatically affect children's behaviour and wellbeing. By letting us know, we will be able to help your child to deal with situations such as a new sibling, a short or lengthy absence of a parent, moving to a new home, the illness or death of a family member, friend or pet, etc. This information will be considered privileged and will remain strictly confidential.

Please notify our school office if you have a change of address, phone number, email address, new helper, or authorised pick-up person. It is important for us to have current information to best serve your child. We also need to be advised of changes to the ones you listed as emergency contacts on your admission form.

Seesaw Platform

Every week your child's class teachers will share observations, images/clips of your child's progress in the class on the online platform, Seesaw. This is our primary means of communication with parents.

Seesaw is a widely used, user-friendly online learning platform which helps teachers to record, track and celebrate children's progress on their learning journey. Important reminders about the class and school will also be shared on the platform. You can also leave notes to our teachers and they will respond to your message during their preparation time. **For any urgent messages, i.e., late pick-up, please call the school directly instead.**

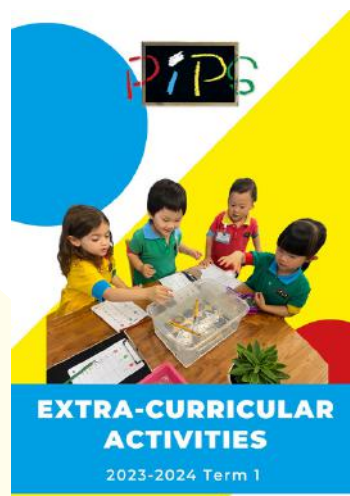
Our teachers have already sent messages inviting parents to the platform. Should you have difficulty getting connected, please let us know.

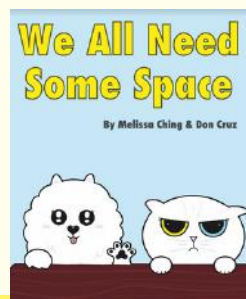
Our U2's outing is always popular with our students! Save the Date in your diary. More details will be announced soon.
