"Show and Tell" is a popular school activity that encourages children to bring an object or project from home to share with their classmates. This activity has numerous benefits for children, including improving their communication skills, boosting confidence, and developing creativity.

During the session, the teachers guide the children and provide support. They help to prepare the class for the presentations and then offer guidance throughout the child's presentation, asking questions to encourage further elaboration. This makes children feel more comfortable and confident when speaking in front of others.

Importantly, "Show and Tell" allows children to showcase their creativity and interests. This helps foster a sense of community and understanding among classmates. Through this activity, children learn to express themselves and communicate their ideas effectively; A vital skill in life.

Parents can also play an instrumental role in supporting their child's participation in show and tell. They can help their child to select an object or project and encourage them to think about what they want to say during their presentation. By asking questions about the object and discussing it with their children, parents can help them plan and prepare for their presentations.

At PIPS, the teachers regularly organise show and tell activities throughout the year. The teachers usually assign a topic to the students, which can either be open-ended or related to a specific unit or topic. For instance, the topic could be as simple as "anything red," or it could be a more complex theme, such as researching and presenting various signs and symbols. The main objective of this activity is to encourage students to exercise their creative and critical thinking skills, as well as to facilitate a collaborative learning environment.

"Show and Tell" is a fun and engaging activity that provides children with a valuable opportunity to practise their communication skills, build their confidence, and showcase their creativity.
